DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Tonight's program is the first public presentation of our second year BFA Acting class. Some of the students in the class have performed in other SDA and ISP productions, but this is their first outing as a company. And, in a sense, the culmination of their first two years of training. It is not so easy to find a play for eight strong men and nine strong women that challenges all and gives each student a featured role and a story to tell. We found the perfect solution in the short plays of Theresa Rebeck (Spike Heels, Sunday on the Rocks, Mauritius, etc.) We are presenting 10 short one act plays by Ms. Rebeck, presented under the title What We're Up Against the title of one of them. In each of them Ms. Rebeck is able to give us a complete story (these are not excerpts, but complete scripts with a depth and detail of many plays that call themselves full length). We have found this work to be challenging, deceptively complex, very actable and, ultimately, both hard work and great fun. Hope you enjoy.

DIRECTOR'S BIO

Jack Rowe is the Director of BFA Acting, Artistic Director and an Associate Professor of Theatre Practice at the USC School of Dramatic Arts. He teaches acting classes in both the BA and BFA programs and directs School of Dramatic Arts productions regularly. He is a founding member of the Company Theatre, a Los Angeles-based theatre company begun by USC graduates in 1967. During its 12-year existence, the Company received awards and acclaim from Los Angeles drama critics and the national press, including such publications as *Time*, *Newsweek* and *The New Yorker*. Rowe worked with the Company as an actor, director, stage manager, composer and musician. He began his professional affiliation with the School of Dramatic Arts in 1979.
