Diary of Events

DECEMBER 16-17

Demonstrations in Timisoara in support of Hungarian priest Laszlo Tokes. Ceausescu visits Iran. Demonstrators in

Timisoara shot. DECEMBER 21

Ceausescu's speech in Bucharest. He is shouted down. That night shooting.

DECEMBER 22

Army goes over to people. Ceausescu escapes. TV station occupied. National Salvation Front formed. More shooting which continues for several days.

DECEMBER 25

Ceausescu captured, tried by military tribunal and shot.

LATE JANUARY AND FEBRUARY

Front announces it will stand in elections.

Demonstrations against Front and Iliescu, and in support.

MAY

Anti-Front demonstrators block center of Bucharest.

MAY 20

Election. Iliescu and Front have large majorities.

Mad Forest

On the plain where
Bucharest now stands
there used to be "a large
forest crossed by small
muddy streams...It could
only be crossed on foot and
was impenetrable for the
foreigner who did not know
the paths...The horsemen of
the steppe were compelled
to go round it, and this

Along with his work at USC, he teaches acting privately in downtown Los Angeles, has taught in the BA and BFA acting programs at CSU Long Beach, CSU Fullerton, and served as guest faculty with Steppenwolf Theatre West Summer Intensive and the USC Summer High School intensive in Los Angeles and Shanghai, China.
