Dear Viewer,

The world you are about to enter is based on a real place right outside Salt Lake City, Utah. It is an institution that advertises itself as a premiere therapeutic haven for troubled teenagers. The business model supports lengthy stays where many cases of abuse have incurred due to a severe lack of oversight by state and local authorities. Most of these kids come from middle to upper class homes. Their parents or insurance plans pay lots of money to keep them safe. At points, this play questions that very safety.

That's also not to discredit the need for children and their families with mental illness and other serious issues to find treatment. I intentionally make room in this play for us to know these boys more intimately so we may continue the conversation of what makes a person want to change without using shame or blame as the modality. Please enjoy the show.

Tamara Ruppart has worked as a director and producer in both theater and film. Film/TV directing credits include *Rising Sun*, *Rising Soul* (doc), Japanese-language film *Path of Dreams* (short), and Season 1 of *Kool School* (edu). *Path of Dreams* has won/been nominated for 17 awards. She is in development of two feature films, and will be mounting the L.A. production of *Broken Story* for the White Horse Theater Company (NYC) in 2021.
