DIRECTOR'S BIO

Gregg T. Daniel is a graduate of NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. For the School of Theatre, he has directed George C. Wolfe's *The Colored Museum* and Girish Karnad's *Naga Mandala*. Gregg is the Artistic Director of the L.A.-based Lower Depth Theatre Ensemble, which mounts classical, contemporary and new works "through the lens of the artist of color." The company recently won a 2011 NAACP theatre award for LDTE's inaugural production, *Three Sisters after Chekhov* by Mustapha Matura. Other credits include *Heroes* by Tom Stoppard for The Group Rep. Theatre and *I Am My Own Wife* by Doug Wright for Theatre 150 in Ojai, Calif. (www.lowerdepththeatreensemble.org)

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

It was five weeks after their marriage in 1959 that Mildred Jeter, a black woman who loved a white man, and Richard Loving were awakened at 2 a.m. and arrested for being married. They were sentenced to one year in jail. It was this landmark case, brought before the Supreme Court in 1967, which exposed the hypocrisy, cruelty and injustice behind anti-miscegenation laws. As our nation continues to struggle with the rights of individuals to love and marry whomever they choose, let us reflect upon the human cost so beautifully rendered in Ms. Childress's play of denying individuals their civil rights.

This production is dedicated to Richard and Mildred Loving.

DRAMATURGICAL NOTE

Anti-Miscegenation laws, also known as "Miscegenation Laws," were laws that enforced racial segregation at the level of marriage and intimate relationships by criminalizing interracial marriage and sometimes also sex between members of two different "races." Such laws remained in force in many U.S. states until 1967.
