### PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE

This is a play about bodies. What we do with them, what others do with them and to them, and what happens to them once we aren't "them" any longer. The "bodies" of this play aren't frozen in the slowness and silence of trauma or death — they live in the loud of the dark and the flash-blinding heat of the light. When our bodies collide with the other bodies that we find in the dark with us, we might scrape against each other or catch fire. But maybe we're supposed to bleed or burn.
