Caridad Svich (*playwright/translator*) received the 2012 OBIE for Lifetime Achievement, the 2011 American Theatre Critics Association Primus Prize and the 2012 Edgerton Foundation New Play Award. Among her key works for theatre are 12 Ophelias, Alchemy of Desire/Dead-Man's Blues, Iphigenia Crash Land Falls..., The Way of Water and Red Bike. She is alumna of New Dramatists, member of EST, founder of NoPassport Theatre alliance and press, and an affiliated artist with the Lark, New Georges and Woodshed Collective. She is editor of several books on theatre and performance, including Fifty Playwrights on Their Craft (Methuen Drama, 2017). Her works are published by Intellect UK, Broadway Play Publishing, Playscripts, Manchester University Press, Smith & Kraus and more. Visit her at www.caridadsvich.com and www.nopassport.org.

Denise Blasor was artistic director of LADiversified & currently Associate Artistic Director of BFA. She's appeared extensively on stage as an actress and has directed in Los Angeles for over twenty years. Some of her favorites include House of Bernarda Alba, The Three Sisters, No Exit, Wild in Wichita, Blood Wedding, The Lost Child. At USC she loved working with her students in Marisol and Anna in the Tropics. Recently she directed/ choreographed the multimedia piece Tormenta Omnis at the Craft & Folk Art Museum in collaboration with artist Gronk and the passion play Cristo Vive at the historic Million Dollar theatre & at the Orpheum Theatre. Films include Coco, A Place Among the Dead directed by Juliet Landau, Noriega; God's Favorite with Bob Hoskins, Death in Granada with Andy Garcia. She's a recording voice artist and her film, Dentro De La Casa De Bernarda Alba, was nominated by the Imagen Award Foundation in 2015 as Best Short.
