### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

Welcome to Ephesus...a port city on the Mediterranean where traders, merchants, and wheeler-dealers from far and near pass through in the name of commerce. It is a place where mountebanks, courtesans, mediums and other colorful characters rub elbows with the keystone cops that try to maintain order in the town run by "Duke" Solinus. And it is here that our adventure takes place and where confusion reigns when Antipholus and Dromio of Syracuse (each, one half of a pair of twins) arrive at the end of seven-year journey in search of their siblings who they have not seen since all four were born on the same day at the same hour over 27 years ago. The two sets of twins are mistaken for each other and hilarity ensues!

We have endeavored to find inspiration in the silent movies and screwball comedies of the 1920s and 1930s. A period that was experimenting with the camera frame much as we are experimenting with the Zoom box during this remote rehearsal and learning period. We are not pretending to be anywhere other than the spaces the performers find themselves and we ask you, our viewers, to take use your imaginations just as Shakespeare urged his theatre goers at the beginning of *Henry V* to "Piece out [their] imperfections with your thoughts..." for "For 'tis your thoughts that now must deck our [twins]."

Should you need lodging we recommend The Centaur and for fine dining please do stop by The Porpentine (top hat and tails required). Should you require the services of a medium to contact the nether world, Madame Pinch is the top medium in town. And, finally, for all your shopping needs you can't go wrong at the outdoor Marketplace known to the locals as The Mart.
