

NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC TEAM

Sophie Treadwell (1885-1970) was an American journalist and playwright born in Stockton, California. After graduating from UC Berkeley where she studied Theatre and Journalism. Treadwell spent a period of time working in vaudeville before turning to writing in 1908. Over the course of her career, she wrote thirty-nine plays, but only seven were ever produced. Regarded by many as the pinnacle of American Expressionist theatre. Machinal is her most successful and best-known play. The play was inspired by the real-life murder trial of Ruth Snyder who killed her husband in 1927. The spectacle of the case drew attention from spectators nationwide, including Treadwell who attended the trial proceedings in her free time. Machinal explores "the how and why" a woman might be driven to kill her own husband.

Expressionism is a theatrical movement that developed in Germany in the early 20th century. Its style of heightened dialogue and physicality is a direct contrast to the Stanislavskian style of realism that was popular with playwrights like Anton Chekhov. The genre was an important influence on Bertholt Brecht's epic theatre.

Expressionist plays are portrayed by being distorted externally, with characters speaking in unusual rhythms in exaggerated emotional states. The characters are labeled as generic figures like Young Woman, The Man, The Mother, etc. to call attention to the characters as types that can be identified instead of as specific individuals. The writing is meant to focus the audience on the raw essence and spectacle of the story.
