#### NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC TEAM

# Dominique Morriseau was born and raised in Detroit, a city born and raised by the auto industry in the early 20th century.

Her play Skeleton Crew, the third in her "Detroit Cycle" of plays, honors the local United Auto Workers (UAW) that showed up, day in and day out, to keep that industry alive during the Great Recession of 2008-09.

As Detroit became a boomtown in the first half of the 20th century, the city's population increased to 1.8 million people. From 1910-1930, the African-American population specifically skyrocketed to 120,000, even though, predominantly, the only jobs open to non-white individuals were back-breaking custodial or foundry jobs. In 1935, the newly formed UAW began to fight for fair wages, more equal opportunities, and tolerable working conditions. Decades ahead of the Civil Rights Act, African-American UAW

workers found job opportunities building cars; jobs they could build lives and raise families on, in what had become the 4th largest city in the country. The Motor City. Motown.

Starting in the late-1940s, though, the Big 3 Automakers sought out cheaper labor and suburban manufacturing locations. The "white" reaction to the outlawing of redlining was to leave the city. Additionally, the police brutality that led to the riots of 1967 lit literal fires from which the city has taken decades to recover. Yet, there were those who persisted. Those who remained faithful to the idea that what they did mattered even when the entire industry seemed set on giving up on them. They fought for themselves, their families, their city. •
