

#### NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC TEAM

THIS IS A PLAYFUL TAKE on the classical themes of the play setting it in a dystopian Trojan world of competition, love, betrayal, rivalries, and youthful actors.

The play begins seven years into the infamous Trojan War with no end in sight. The cause of the war can be traced all the way back to the wedding of Peleus and Thetis, the noted future parents of the warrior Achilles. Eris, the Goddess of Strife, brought to the wedding a golden apple meant for the most beautiful goddess. Eris did not specify which goddess the apple was meant for, leading to a contest between the goddesses Athena, Hera, and Aphrodite. To end the quarrel, the god Zeus ordered Paris, a prince of Troy, to decide. In exchange for awarding her the apple, Athena promised Paris strength in battle. Hera promised him immense wealth. Aphrodite promised him the love of the most beautiful mortal woman, Helen, the wife of the Greek King Menelaus. It is unclear if Helen consented to this, but it is clear that she was taken from Greece to the city of Troy. This then incited King Menelaus to wage war against the Trojans, specifically attacking the city of Troy.

Troilus and Cressida is often known as a "problem play." It contains the humor of comedies, the death of tragedies, and, unlike histories, the story and characters are based in myth. It's a deep look into what the Trojan War could have been like, and Shakespeare employs the popular fabled story as an outlet to discuss his own thoughts on the pointlessness of many wars and the dangers of valuing carnal desire over duty. ■
