Denied Degrees —Women's Fight for Education in Victorian England

In 1896, women were finally allowed to attend classes at Cambridge University in England—but they could not earn degrees.

The following year, when a vote was proposed to grant them this right, the backlash was swift and brutal. Protesters hurled eggs, launched fireworks, and mutilated an effigy of the "New Woman" on her bicycle. The bicycle symbolized not just fears of women's growing independence, but also anxieties over their perceived immodesty—in both practical and provocative ways, straddling a bike challenged the rigid Victorian ideals of femininity. Dr. Henry Maudsley, a leading psychiatrist of the time, warned that intellectual pursuits would render women unfit for motherhood, claiming, "These, sirs, are not opinions. They are facts of nature, proven by science."

This was the world faced by the first women at Cambridge—brilliant, determined, yet forced to justify their place in a system built to exclude them. Blue Stockings brings their fight to life, showing the camaraderie, resistance, and sacrifices required to push the boundaries of what was possible. Some professors supported them, others opposed them. Some men were allies, others their fiercest enemies. And through it all, these women had to decide: Was the chance to learn worth the cost?

Today, more than a century later, women's rights remain a contested battleground whether in education, the workplace, or personal autonomy. The struggles of the past remind us how hard-won progress is, and how easily it can be threatened. The right to ride a bicycle may seem trivial now, but the right to move forward—without barriers—remains a fight we cannot take for granted.
