



NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC TEAM:

Guys & Dolls opened on Broadway 75 years ago this month. Though it was shaped by a stylized vision of postwar 1950, many of the Damon Runyon short stories that inspired the musical were first published in 1932. Our production is set in that specific moment in the Summer of '32—when Franklin Delano Roosevelt delivered his famous "New Deal" speech ahead of the presidential election, when Runyon was one of the most popular writers in America, and when his "Runyonland" offered a bright, comic escape from the hardships of the Great Depression. At the time, roughly a quarter of the American workforce was unemployed, and many turned to gambling, entertainment, or to the church in search of hope and redemption. Despite their outsized personalities, these characters still have something to teach us 75 years later: they're not just betting on crap games, politicians, or the church to save them.
